The National Student Engagement Programme or NStEP is focused on creating a collaborative partnership between the university and the students. For most UL students this year NStEP will be the programme that provides training to Class Representatives and Student Council Representatives on how to be effective student representatives.

This training is mandatory but, don't worry you must complete the session just once. You can choose more advanced trainings. All time goes towards your PVA & your NStEP Student Engagement Recognition award. We will email you when sessions are available!

INTRODUCE YOURSELF

Let your lecturer know you've been elected and ask them for help in spreading the word to your classmates. Reach out to your Department Rep and your academic officer. Unsure who they are? find out on our website.

STAY IN TOUCH

Key to being a good class representative is **keeping in touch.** Think, what is the best way to contact your classmates? Set up a WhatsApp group, Discord, etc.

GET CREƏTIVE

Advocating for your class mates is important, but so is creating a community. One way you can clock up hours is by participating in study groups, going on a night out together, or even playing a game online.

Ask your lecturer to send an email around with the link/name of your chosen chat group & your details.






WHƏT IS THE STUDENT LEƏRNING EXPERIENCE?

The <u>Student Learning</u> <u>Experience</u> is divided into seven areas that covers

everything students need academically in their college life.

Class reps use these headings to guide them when gathering student feedback for the various UL student-staff forums. The NStEP training goes through these seven areas in detail.



Class reps should only deal with items under these headings and **DO NOT** take on student's personal issues. Support is available for those struggling with personal issues through UL and UL Student Life, contact information is provided in this handbook.

Issues not to deal with:

- Harassment & serious conflict.
- Students' personal problems.
- Taking notes for other students.
- Taking personal abuse from any student or member of staff. Please talk to UL Student Life Academic Officer, Ronan Mannix if this happens.
- Proof reading or tutoring fellow students.

APPROƏCHING YOUR Lecturer

When a classmate approaches you with an issue/request you must email/talk with the class to get feedback on the issue so you can establish the majority of the class opinion. **The Leaders for Life 'Harnessing Student Opinion' module can help you with this.**

Then you should:

- Make an appointment with the lecturer to discuss the issue
- Remember ABCDE when going into a meeting:





APPROƏCHING YOUR Lecturer

Work through a solution with the lecturer.

Close the feedback loop by reporting back to the class on the outcome of the meeting with the lecturer.


If the lecturer is unresponsive or uncooperative bring the issue to the Course coordinator, Head of the Department or the Academic Officer who can advise on the next step.

Leaders for Life and NStEP training provide fantastic guidance and resources on how to be prepared going into meetings and communicating with lecturers, and your classmates.





STUDENT COUNCIL



WHAT IS STUDENT COUNCIL?

The Student Council is made up of 56 students who discuss and vote on UL Student Life policy. As the representative group of all UL students they direct Executive on what work to carry out. Council meets every second Tuesday at 6pm.

WHO ARE THE COUNCIL MEMBERS?

All members are UL students, 26 are elected Department Representatives for each of UL's academic departments, and 18 are Interest Group Representatives with particular responsibility for specific student life and welfare areas. The 12 Executive members attend Council. Only the volunteer Executive members have a vote. The President, Welfare, Academic and Communities student officers do not have a vote.



STUDENT COUNCIL

WHAT DO DEPARTMENT REPS DO?

- Bring forward their department's issues and interests to Council.
- Liaise with Class Reps within their department. Create a Messenger group / WhatsApp account for the Class Reps to have informal chats.
- Attend Class Rep training.
- Introduce themselves to the Head of Department via email. Request that they are invited to course board meetings.
- Liaise directly with the Course Director to offer constructive feedback and highlight unresolved Class Rep issues. Contact the Academic Officer if there is difficulty resolving an issue.
- Attend and participate at Student Council and relevant Council sub-committee meetings.
- Hold the Executive to account.

WHAT DO STUDENT COUNCILLORS DO?

- Get feedback from the wider student body for their particular interest area.
- Research and promote relevant initiatives within UL and outside of UL that benefit students.
- Liaise and meet regularly with their interest group and Chairperson.
- Attend and participate at Student Council and relevant Council sub-committee meetings.
- Hold the Executive to account.



STUDENT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

WHƏT IS THE EXECUTIVE?

The Executive are a working group of 12 students who are elected by you to help implement students' ideas, run campaigns, support student led activities and represent students' interests with the University at every level. The UL Student Life General Manager is also a member but does not have a vote.

WHAT DO THE EXECUTIVE DO?

Each Executive member has responsibility to act as the main representatives for a particular aspect of student life on campus. They must consult with and listen to students to be effective representatives.

The President is the primary UL student representative within the university and nationally.

The Exec meet weekly and attend Student Council every second Tuesday. They report to Council on the work they have done on students' behalf and feedback on the University meetings they attended.

The Exec members meet with students daily whether it be to hear their ideas for UL Student Life or give guidance on the many issues students may be dealing with e.g. medical, financial difficulties, accommodation, exam papers, progression, etc.

The four full-time Student Officers and PSU President sit on over 40 University committees representing the interests of all students.

Exec members: Get aonline votes from current UL students.

F<u>aculties' officer:</u> They are elected from sitting Faculty Reps on Student Council.

<u>Clubs and Societies Officers:</u> They are elected by Clubs and Societies Council.

<u>PSU Rep:</u> They are an appointed nominee of the PSU Exec.

Full-Time Student Officers

President, Deputy President Welfare, Vice President Academic and Vice President Communities are elected by the Student body in March each year. The election this year will take place in Second Semester 2024.

If you're interested in running, you must get digital signatures of 20 current UL students to support your nomination. All candidates must submit their manifestos with their completed online nomination form.

Uncontested candidates run against RON (Reopen nominations) to ensure that they are the right candidate for the job.
